7. Cast Vision

Chrysostom, a Christian leader in the fourth century, was arrested by the Roman emperor and charged with being a Christian. He was ordered to renounce Christ or be banished from the kingdom! Chrysostom responded saying that the emperor could not do so, "because the whole world is my Father's kingdom." "Then," replied the emperor, "I will take away your life." To which Chrysostom answersed, "You cannot, for my life is hidden with Christ in God." Next threatened with the loss of his treasure, this saint replied, "You cannot, for my treasure is in heaven where my heart is." The emperor made one last effort: "Then I will drive you away from here and you shall have no friend left." But again Chrysostom responded, "You cannot, for I have one Friend from whom you can never separate me. I defy you for vou can do me no harm."

When we know and serve the living God, no one touch what we hold most dear! Go tell others about this God who is worth more than any treasure you could ever possess on earth!

Do's and Do Not's

- Do keep it short (1 hour or less).
- **Do** let the Holy Spirit be the teacher.
- **Do** remember to study for obedience rather than for knowledge!
- **Don't** dominate the conversation; encourage everyone to participate. Facilitator = 30%, Participants = 70%
- · Don't demand correct answers.
- Don't get distracted, stay on topic.
- Don't be afraid to say "I don't know the answer, I'll get back to you."
