3/3 Session for New Believers

Topic: The Word of God is Food for Our Souls Question: How does God speak to us through the Bible?

Report & Celebrate (20-40 minutes)

1. Share & Care

Share life's journey by spending time together and communicating during the week. Talk about your joys and your struggles, and support one another in prayer.



2. Accountability Following Jesus

- Share as many memory verses as you can remember from the past four lessons.
- What have you learned as you've read your Bible?

Fishing for Jesus

- Which family and friends have you been praying for?
- Has God given you opportunities to witness? If not, what opportunities did you miss? Excuses made?
- Are you discipling anyone?



3. Worship

Praise God for what has just been shared. Use a song, read a Psalm, or share a testimony of answered prayer!



Notes:

 Train your disciples to disciple others by encouraging each of them to take turns leading. Start by giving them experience leading one section, then have a short debrief after the group with them one-on-one. Be sure to affirm them in what they did well and share suggestions for improvement.

Hear & Obey (20-40 minutes)

4. New Lesson - What does the story SAY? Have participants look up 2 Timothy 3:15-17, Joshua 1:8. Matthew 4:4. Psalm 119:9-11. 97-99,105, and Hebrews 4:12. Read through each one once.



Learn

What do you think this means: "All Scripture is inspired by God"?

Reread the passages one at a time and discuss:

- What purpose does God's word play in our lives? (Appoint someone to make a list.)
- What promises does God give us when we obey Him?
- How important is it to read the Bible? Why?

5. Application - What must I OBEY?

• What is God leading me to do or change in my life?

Notes:

Before reading Joshua 1:8, explain that "The Book of Instruction" refers to the first five books of he Old Testament. It was the "Bible" the people had at that time.

Guide

- Before reading 2 Timothy 3:15-17, explain that Paul is writing this letter to his disciple Timothy.
- "All Scripture is inspired by God" means God-breathed, He told the authors what to write, which means Scripture is accurate a

Do's and Do Not's

- Do let the Holy Spirit be the teacher.
- **Do** remember to study for obedience rather than for knowledge!
- **Don't** dominate the conversation; encourage everyone to participate. Facilitator = 30%, Participants = 70%
- Don't demand correct answers.
- Don't get distracted, stay on topic.

God's Word is Important!

2 Timothy 3:15-17

15 You have been taught the holy Scriptures from childhood, and they have given you the wisdom to receive the salvation that comes by trusting in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. 17 God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work.

Study this Book of Instruction continually. Meditate on it day and night so you will be sure to obey everything written in it. Only then will you prosper and succeed in all you do.

Matthew 4:4b
