3/3 Session for New Believers

Topic: Prayer: A Direct Line to God

Question: How can we talk to God?

Report & Celebrate (20-40 minutes)

1. Share & Care

Share life's journey by spending time together and communicating during the week. Talk about your joys and your struggles, and support one another in prayer.



2. Accountability

Following Jesus

• What has God taught you from His Word? How has it impacted your life?



Report

Fishing for Jesus

- Did you share last week's lesson? How did it go?
- Are you discipling anyone? To what extent are you investing in them?



3. Worship

Praise God for what has just been shared. Use a song, read a Psalm, or share a testimony of answered prayer!



Notes:

- Remind the group that we want to see lives impacted with the Gospel.
 Our goal is to make disciples who make disciples and to establish simple New Testament churches.
- Always remember that you are modelling for others. Future trainers will train like you do, so keep it simple and don't get too creative!
- Celebrate any steps of obedience in your accountability time! If people
 are having trouble in this area, stop and pray together, then make
 specific plans for the coming week.

"Anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!" 2 Corinthians 5:17

Hear & Obey (20-40 minutes)

4. New Lesson - What does the story **SAY**? Have participants read the passages in two different versions.



Learn

- What do you learn about God or Jesus in this story?
- What are the 5 main things we need to include in our prayers based on Jesus' model?

praise, worship (v. 9) purpose - what part you can play in this (v. 10) provision for self and others (v. 11) pardon and confession (v 12) protection (v. 13)

• Sum up these passages in one or two sentences.

5. Application - What must I **OBEY**?



- In this story, is there a command I will obey?
- What is God leading me to do or change in my life?

Notes:

 Prayer is simple, it is just talking with God. You don't need to use special words, be in a special place, or even close your eyes. You can talk to God any time, anywhere!



- During the discussion help your disciples to understand this is a <u>pattern</u> for prayer, not merely a prayer to be repeated!
- Participants should bring a journal and record their "obedience" goals and their stated plan in section 7.

Do's and Do Not's

- Do let the Holy Spirit be the teacher.
- Do remember to study for obedience rather than for knowledge!
- **Don't** dominate the conversation; encourage everyone to participate. Facilitator = 30%, Participants = 70%
- **Don't** demand correct answers.
- Don't get distracted, stay on topic.

Jesus Teaches His Disciples to Pray

Matthew 6:5-15

5 [Jesus said] "When you pray, don't be like the hypocrites who love to pray publicly on street corners and in the synagogues where everyone can see them. I tell you the truth, that is all the reward they will ever get. 6 But when you pray, go away by yourself, shut the door behind you, and pray to your Father in private. Then your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

7 "When you pray, don't babble on and on as people of other religions do. They think their prayers are answered merely by repeating their words again and again. 8 Don't be like them, for your Father knows exactly what you need even before you ask Him!

9 Pray like this:

Our Father in heaven, may Your name be kept holy.

10 May Your Kingdom come soon. May Your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.

11 Give us today the food we need,

12 and forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us.

13 And don't let us yield to temptation, but rescue us from the evil one.

14 "If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. 15 But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins."

The Power of Prayer

Philippians 4:6-7

6 Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank Him for all He has done. 7 Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

8. Cast Vision
