Report & Celebrate (20-40 minutes)

1. Share & Care

Share life's journey by spending time together and communicating during the week. Talk about your joys and your struggles, and support one another in prayer.

3. Worship

Praise God for what has just been shared. Use a song, read a Psalm, or share a testimony of answered prayer!

- Always remember that you are modelling for others! Future trainers will train like you do, so keep it simple and don't get too creative!
- Participants should continue bringing their journals so they can share what God is doing in their lives and so they can continue to record down their “obedience” goals.

Hear & Obey (20-40 minutes)

4. New Lesson - What does the story **SAY**?

Read John 4:4-39.

- *What do you like about this story?*
- *What do you learn about how Jesus engages the woman in conversation and keeps her interest?*
- *What types of people does Jesus engage? Who does He invest time in?*
- *What choices did people in this story make?*



Learn

Read Matthew 28:19-20, Colossians 4:5-6 and 1 Peter 3:15-16.

- *What are our jobs as followers of Jesus?*
- *Jesus told His disciples to “go and make disciples”. Based on what you have learned and experienced over the past few weeks, how do you “make disciples?”*

5. Application - What must I **OBEY**?

- *What is God leading me to do in response to what I have learned today?*

Do's and Do Not's

- **Do** let the Holy Spirit be the teacher.
- **Do** remember to study for obedience rather than for knowledge!
- **Don't** dominate the conversation; encourage everyone to participate. Facilitator = 30%, Participants = 70%
- **Don't** demand correct answers.
- **Don't** get distracted, stay on topic.

Jesus and the Samaritan Woman

John 4:4-10, 19, 25-30, 39a

4 He [Jesus] had to go through Samaria on the way. 5 Eventually He came to the Samaritan village of Sychar, near the field that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. 6 Jacob's well was there; and Jesus, tired from the long walk, sat wearily beside the well about noontime. 7 Soon a Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, *“Please give me a drink.”* 8 He was alone at the time because His disciples had gone into the village to buy some food. 9 The woman was surprised, for Jews refuse to have anything to do with Samaritans. She said to Jesus, “You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. Why are you asking me for a drink?” 10 Jesus replied, *“If you only knew the gift God has for you and who you are speaking to, you would ask Me, and I would give you living water.”*... 19 “Sir,” the woman said, “you must be a prophet.”... 25 The woman said, “I know the Messiah is coming—the One who is called Christ. When He comes, He will explain everything to us.” 26 Then Jesus told her, *“I AM the Messiah!”*... 27 Just then His disciples came back. They were shocked to find Him talking to a woman, but none of them had the nerve to ask, “What do you want with her?” or “Why are you talking to her?” 28 The woman left her water jar beside the well and ran back to the village, telling everyone, 29 “Come and see a man who told me everything I ever did! Could He possibly be the Messiah?” 30 So the people came streaming from the village to see Him... 39 Many Samaritans from the village believed in Jesus...

Matthew 28:19-20a

19 *“Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. 20 Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you...”*

Colossians 4:5-6

5 Live wisely among those who are not believers, and make the most of every opportunity. 6 Let your conversation be gracious and attractive so that you will have the right response for everyone.

1 Peter 3:15b-16a

15 If someone asks about your hope as a believer, always be ready to explain it. 16 But do this in a gentle and respectful way....
